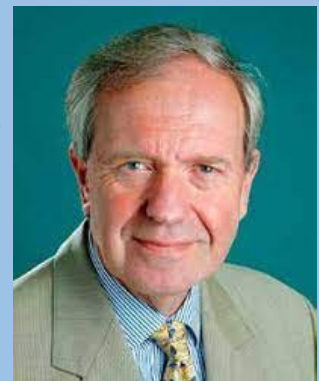

Steven Hovius

The first bilateral hand transplantation in the Netherlands: results after 2 years

Prof Dr Steven Hovius worked for 33 years at the plastic surgery department of the Erasmus MC Rotterdam and is at the Radboud UMC Nijmegen. He has had a significant contribution for the development of hand surgery. He is an advocate of the importance of hand therapy to be part and parcel of hand surgery in the rehabilitation of patients with hand problems. He and his team at the Radboud UMC Nijmegen were the first to perform a bilateral hand transplantation in the Netherlands.



Shrikant Chinchalkar

Wound Healing and Decision Making in Hand Therapy.

Mr Shrikant J. Chinchalkar, OTR, CHT, OT.Reg.(On) worked as a hand therapist at the Roth-McFarlane Hand & Upper Limb Centre, St. Joseph's Health Centre in London, Ontario, Canada and has over 47 years of clinical experience in treating upper extremity conditions, nearly 40 years of teaching and 30 years of research experience.

He designed and developed Hand Therapy programs at four major teaching centers in Canada including Roth-McFarlane Hand & Upper Limb Centre in London, Ontario.

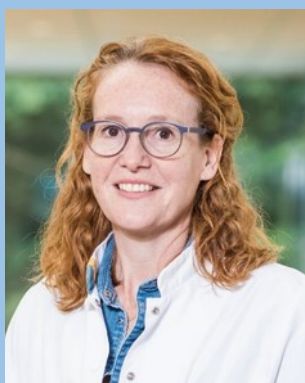


Pascal Hannemann
